LIGHT: Bright, indirect light. Rotate your plant once a month so that it grows evenly. Keep away from cold drafts as it is a tropical plant.

SOIL: Keep it well-drained. If the pot doesn't have a drain hole, place rocks at the bottom of the pot before you put the soil in. This will help with drainage, keeping root rot at bay.

WATER: Water when the top inch of the soil becomes dry. Using a plant moisture meter makes things easier.

FERTILIZE: Fertilize during Spring and Summer months only. A general purpose houseplant fertilizer works fine.

TOXICITY: This plant is toxic to pets and humans when ingested.
